Advantages of Free Tutoring

Many students may find themselves struggling with at least one subject area or course. The Learning Center offers free tutoring to students in need of basic writing, math, and research skills, and attempts to match students with tutors in any other area of academic need.

In remedial and intro level Math and English, over 80% of the students pass their courses successfully with consistent tutoring, in comparison to 60% without any or with minimal tutoring.

Tips for a Successful Tutoring Session

- Be prepared for the tutoring session before it begins. That means communicating with your tutor about the areas with which you are struggling, sharing your syllabus and/or assignments with your tutor before the session, and coming to the tutoring session ready to work. Please send the materials to tutors electronically.
- Understand the importance of communicating with your tutor. Tutors do not have access to your class materials. You must provide them with the information to help you succeed on a regular basis. That is why it is important to check your BU email account regularly.
- Be flexible and polite. The tutors will work around your schedule, but you will need to work around their schedule as well. If you are going to miss a session, please let the tutor and the Tutoring Services Coordinator know beforehand and be on time for your tutoring session.
- You can request tutoring before your class even begins! You can also receive tutoring for only a portion of the time during the Module. When you sign up for tutoring, you can stop services at any time when you feel like you no longer need them.
